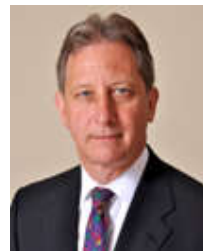

About SOTG

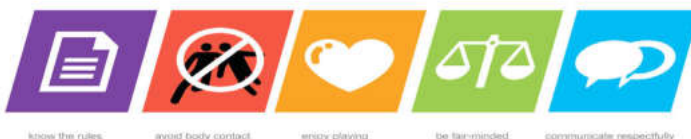
Ultimate relies upon a Spirit of the Game that places the responsibility for fair play on every player. Spirit of the Game (SOTG) is the mindful behaviour practiced by players prior to, during and after a game of ultimate. It encompasses attitudes and skills such as good knowledge and application of the rules, fair-mindedness, safe play and spatial awareness, clear and calm communication, and a positive and respectful attitude towards teammates, fans, and opponents, in a mutual effort to protect the basic joy of play.

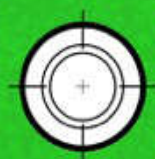
We strongly believe that Spirit of the Game helps people to develop skills in polite, calm and respectful communication even in difficult situations, and to make friends all over the world despite ethnic, national or religious differences. Spirit of the Game promotes understanding and peace in our sport, and we hope that through each player, that influence can spread beyond the field and make real changes in the outside world.

At WU24, every team in every division has chosen a Spirit Captain. It is this player's responsibility to work with their team and all opposition teams to ensure that the highest standard of the Spirit of the Game is maintained throughout the competition (both on and off the field).

A Spirit scoring system has been developed to evaluate the other team immediately after each game. With all players involved and led by the Spirit Captain, each team fills in a Spirit scoresheet. Using guidelines and examples found in the Spirit scoring examples document, each team can provide a more consistent score for the other teams. The Spirit scoring system therefore serves as an educational tool where teams can learn how to improve based on standardized feedback. To celebrate Spirit of the Game, an award is presented to the team in each division with the highest total Spirit score. Winning this award is held in the highest regard and all teams strive to achieve this.

Good luck to all athletes. Your physical and mental abilities represent the pinnacle of our sport in your age group. You have the opportunity to demonstrate the highest values of sports competition through the Spirit of the Game. Fans and spectators, you can look forward to some incredible action and even more incredible displays of Spirit throughout the Championships.





AIM

The aim of GAs is to support the Players to self-officiate as effectively and efficiently as possible. Players remain responsible for making and resolving all game calls.



RULES ADVICE

During stoppages GAs can help to clarify the rules, if asked by the Players.



TIME LIMITS

GAs closely monitor time limits in accordance with the rules, including in between points, time outs, and during discussions, and encourage teams to comply with these rules.



NON BINDING ADVICE

If Players need help resolving any call they may ask the GA for their advice. This advice is non-binding and Players must still make the call.



WHISTLES

GAs give information to Players about time limits by using whistles, but also by providing verbal advice.



SIDELINE ROLE

GAs remain on the sideline during play. They may come on to the field during stoppages, if needed.



SPIRIT OF THE GAME

If GAs have concerns about Spirit they can talk to the Captains, the Players involved, or can even call a SOTG Stoppage to help the Players resolve the issue.



MISCONDUCT

In extreme circumstances GAs can issue warnings and/or enforce sanctions in accordance with the WFDF Conduct Policy.

PICK

HAND SIGNALS

GAs use hand signals to echo the calls made by the Players, for the benefit of other Players and spectators. They also actively signal to inform the opposition of Offside violations, but the Players must still make the call.



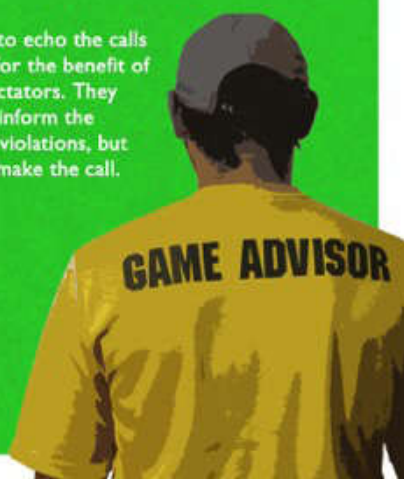

General Information

Facilities

The fields at our North and South tournament locations are not one big sports complex, but a mix of different sports clubs. Not all fields you will see in the area are WU24 fields. Please only use fields marked on the tournament map in this booklet or labeled as part of WU24 (look for signs, tents etc.) for play and warm-up. Respect the local clubs and be good representatives of the ultimate community. The same goes for Toilets and washrooms – taking care of your business anywhere else (bushes, fences etc.) will lead to tournament disqualification! The official toilets and changing rooms are marked on the tournament map. If you're not sure, ask someone! Please note that dogs or other pets are not allowed at the fields or in the stadium.

Playing fields should not be used for warm-up. Please use the assigned warm-up fields.

Lightning protocol

Thunderstorms are not unusual in the summer. Different indoor meeting points for lightning breaks are assigned to each field. If you see lightning please stop play immediately and seek shelter (marked on the tournament map). Please follow the lead of the volunteers/scorekeepers.

Heat and Hydration

Summer is hot in Heidelberg and we are in one of the warmest areas in Germany. This can lead to longer periods of 30°C or more. Heatwaves have also been common in Europe over the past few summers and 2019 seems to be no exception.

Make sure you're drinking plenty of water, even when you don't feel thirsty and seek shade in between games. In Germany drinking water (Trinkwasser) from the tap has higher hygiene standards than bottled water, so it's very safe to drink. The city of Heidelberg has provided taps and water hoses to assure quality drinking water. Water areas are marked on the tournament map and you can also use any water outlet in the toilet facilities.

Medical Information

First-aid responders will be on-site. The next hospital is the Heidelberger University Clinic right next to the North location. Please check with a Volunteer first.

General Information

Accreditation and admission

You will receive the event accreditations per team (players & staff) at registration. Make sure you have your ID with you at all times. To be eligible to enter the sports grounds and play, you will need your tournament ID. It also serves as your free public transport ticket. If you lose your ID, please come to the South tournament central and request a replacement. There may be a small fee to cover the cost of producing a replacement.

Everyone who is not registered with an ID is welcome for free to most of the games throughout the week. They must have tickets for the Opening Ceremony & Game, the daily Top Games on the main field, and the Finals. You can buy tickets online or at the gate.

Food & Drinks

If your team ordered the WU24 lunch packages they can be picked up daily at the tournament competition location (North & South, depending on where you are playing that day) beginning at 11 a.m. until 2 p.m. If you did not order lunch packages, you will have different options available.

Some of the local clubs partnered with us and will provide fresh food throughout the week. All of them have a lot of experience catering for large sporting events. At the North Location you will have to pay cash, at the South location you need to buy tokens at the Token Booth next to Field 13.

North location:

You can buy lunch at the GVO Cantine in the Olympic Center (next to field 5) or at the club restaurant next to Field 2. Cool drinks are available at Field 7.

South location:

You can buy lunch at the HRK Cantine (next to Field 13) and at local food trucks (also next to Field 13) – remember to buy Tokens. Cool drinks are available at the player's tent.

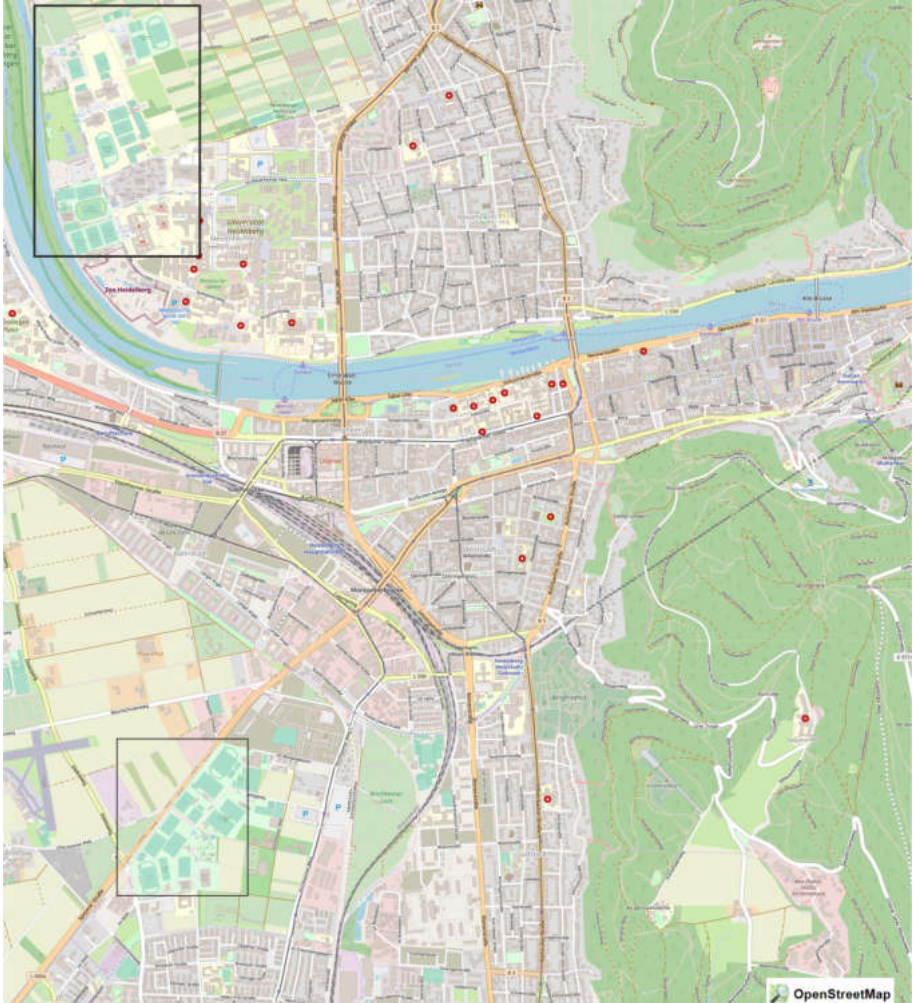

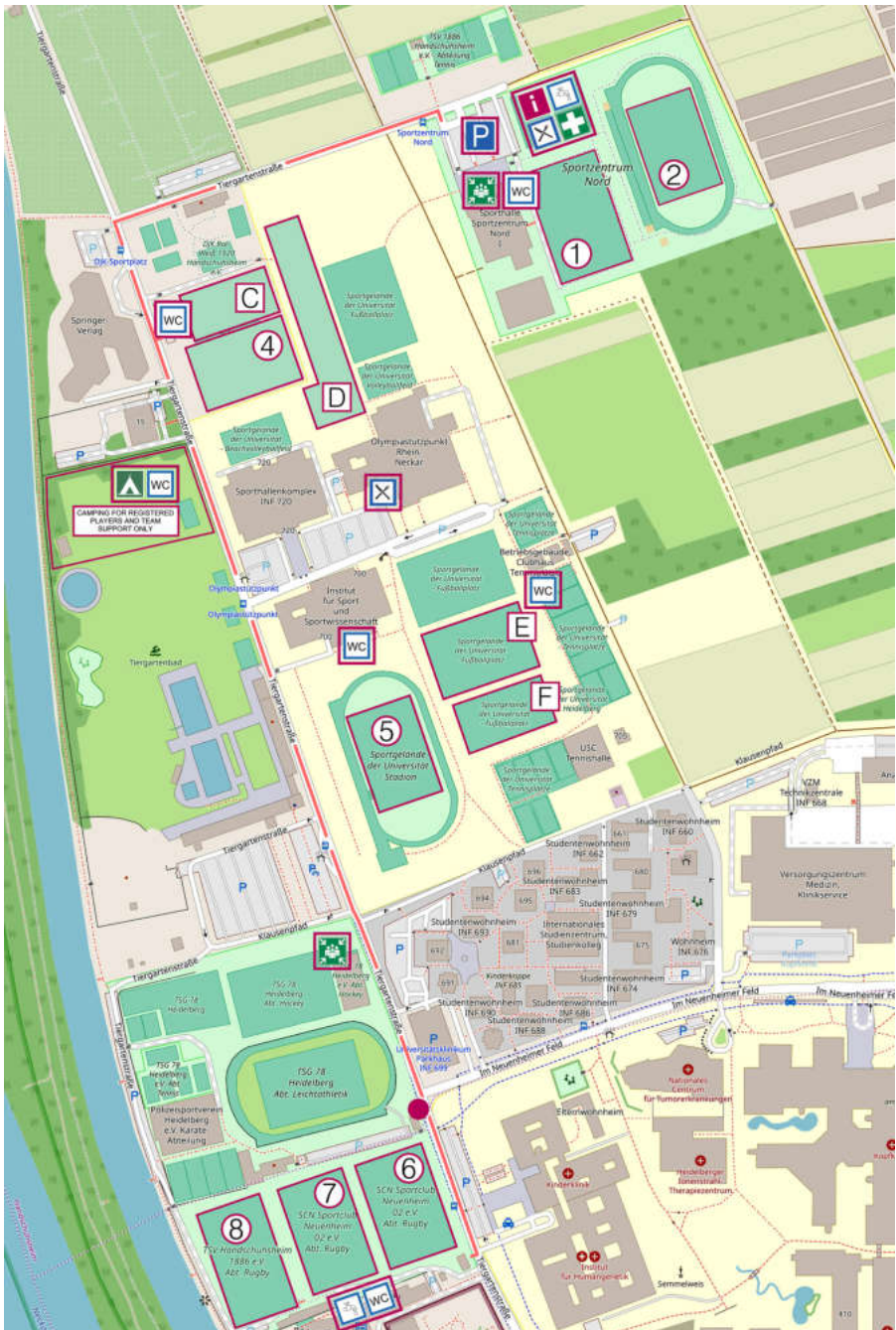

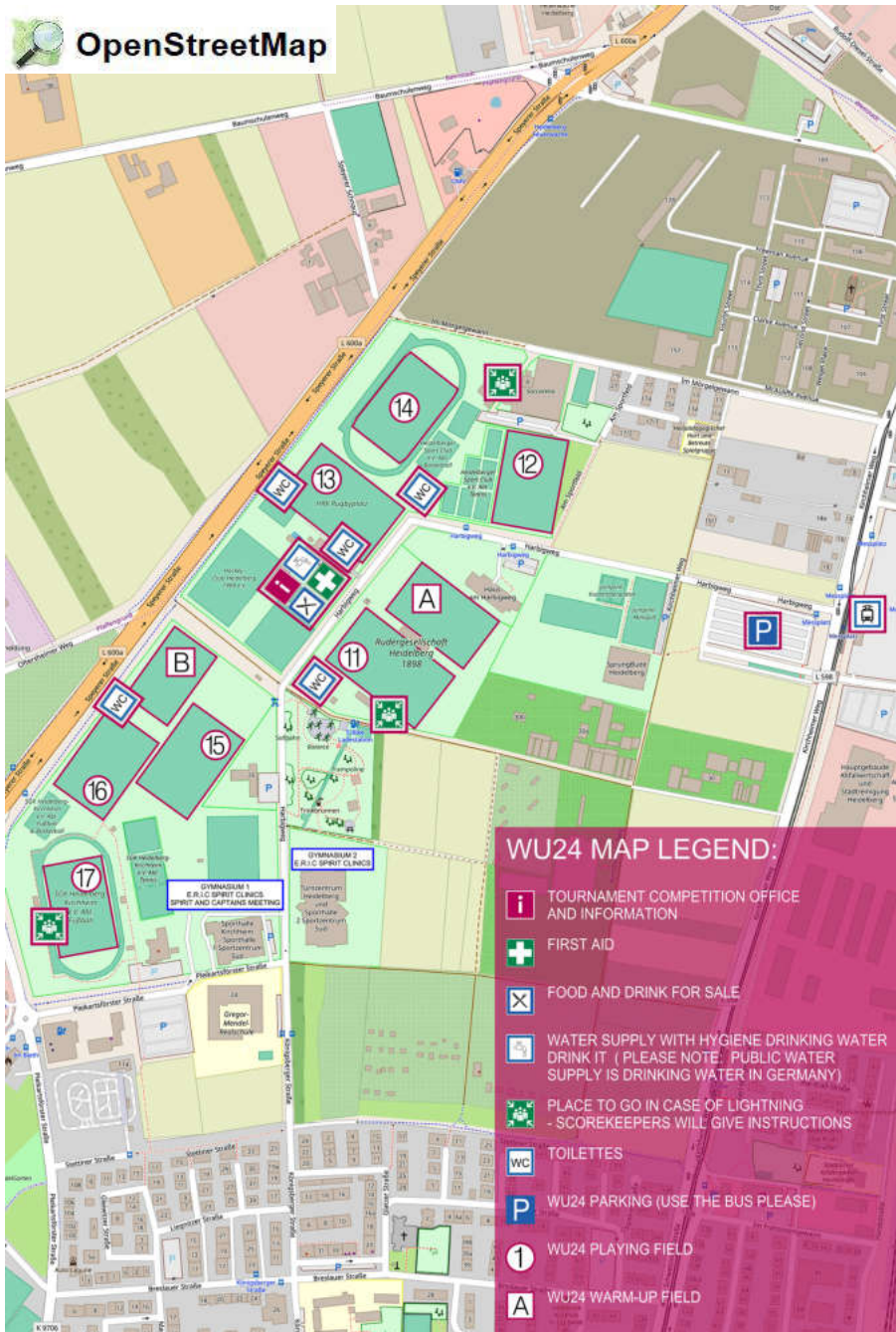
Heidelberg - Map



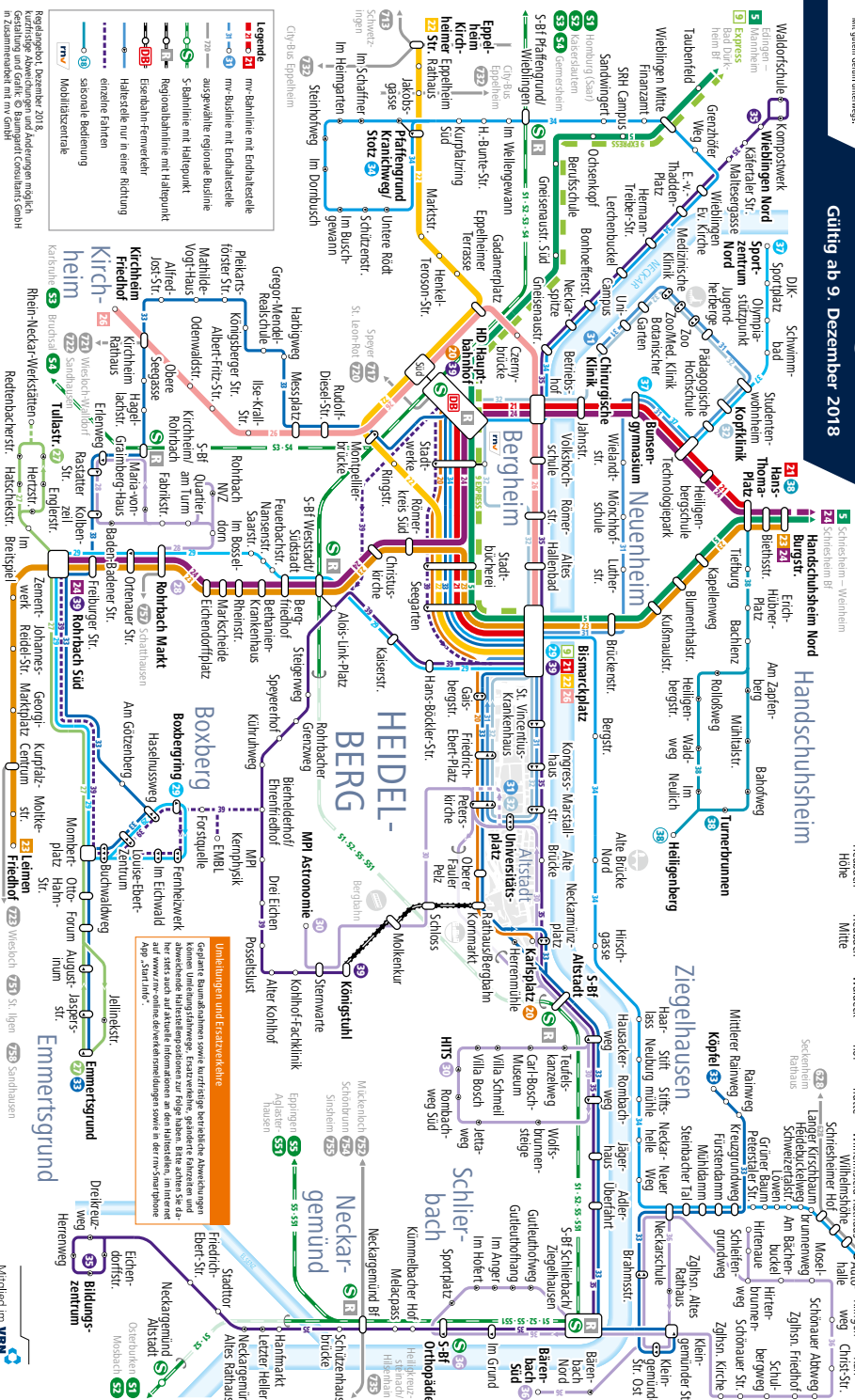
North Fields - Map

Transportation

Public Transport operates well in Germany, allowing all visitors to get around easily and economically on buses, trams and trains. A Public transportation ticket for the Rhein Neckar region will be provided for free travel for all registered participants (show your tournament ID card). This will allow everyone to get around Heidelberg for free with ease without using your own vehicle. For detailed information and connections see www.bahn.com or get the myVRN App for your smartphone. Here you can see a summary of the most common routes for WU24 participants:

Hauptbahnhof/Central Station (HBF) Heidelberg (HD) to the South Fields:

Use HBF South Exit (station Bahnstadt Hauptbahnhof Süd), use Tram 26 - Direction HD-Kirchheim, Exit Messplatz, walk to the Fields (500 meters, marked on the Fields map)

From HBF HD to North Fields:

Use HBF North Exit, (station HD Hauptbahnhof West), use Tram 24 - Direction Handschuhsheim, Exit Technologiepark, transfer to Bus 37 (same platform) - Direction Tiergartenstrasse, Exit Studentenwohnheim (**Fields 6-8**), Schwimmbad (**Field 5**), DJK Sportplatz (**Field 4**) or Sportzentrum Nord (**Field 1-2**). All Exits are marked on the Fields map

From North Fields to HBF HD

Fields 1-5: Use Bus 37 (stations see above) – Direction Bundengymnasium, Exit Bunsengymnasium, transfer to Tram 24 – Direction Hauptbahnhof

Fields 6-8: Use Bus 32 (station Jugendherberge) – Direction Bismarckplatz

From Weinheim (station Rosenbrunnen) & Hirschberg (station Leutershausen Bf.)

Use Tram 5 - Direction Heidelberg, Exit Hans-Thoma-Platz, Transfer to Tram 24 – Direction Hauptbahnhof/Betriebshof, Exit Technologiepark, transfer to Bus 37 as explained above.

Player Party Shuttle (PPS) running from “Im Bieth” Busstation to Halle 02 - 8 p.m. - 10 p.m. only!

Friday night Party bus running from Halle 02 to HBF HD (North Exit) first stop, to Jugendherberge/Campground Tiergartenstrasse second stop, than back to Halle 02. Last Bus leaving Halle 02 at 2.30 am!

Direction Hirschberg/Weinheim use Tram 5 running from North Exit HBF HD to your accomodation

Transportation

Central Station/Hauptbahnhof (HBF) is a big construction site right now. It might be a little bit difficult to find your bus/tram spot for the first time.

If you leave the Central Station through the north exit and main hall (after passing all the shops) you will find the station for the North Fields on your left. If you leave the Central Station through the south exit (smaller exit on the other side of the tracks) go left and right up the small hill. You will find the tram station to the South fields on your left.

Do not hesitate to ask anyone. The locals will be happy to help you since they have to struggle with the construction every day.



Social Events

Opening Ceremony

The Ceremony will take place on Saturday, 13th of July, at the South location (Field 14). Please arrive at the venue at 4 p.m. and meet with your team at field 13 – do not forget your playing jersey for the parade of nations. The ceremony will be followed by the Opening Game: Germany against Belgium in the Women's division.

Castle Illuminations

On Saturday evening, following the Opening Game the annual castle illuminations (Schlossbeleuchtung) will be held in the Heidelberg city center. It's one of the largest firework festivals in Germany. Find yourself a good spot on the river shores and watch the magical lights surrounding the Heidelberg castle. We suggest meeting at the "Neckarwiese" on the north shore. Fireworks will start after dark (approx. 10 p.m.). Please note that the city will be full of visitors and public transportation might be crowded.

Trading night (or afternoon)

Come to the player's tent at the South location on Friday and join us for the trading night. The trading night, accompanied by a musical live act, will happen from 4 p.m. until 7 p.m. near the semi-finals happening on the surrounding fields.

Player's party (Friday)

The tournament party will be on Friday night at the "Halle02" right next to the Heidelberg Central Station. Special busses will go to and from the party (see Transportation section). All registered participants over the age of 16 (according to German law for youth protection) will have free entry with their tournament ID. Guests can pay admission at the door, but there is limited capacity at the venue and players will have preference. Tickets are also available online if you want guaranteed entry. The Party starts at 8 p.m. and closes at 1:30 a.m.

Final Rock

Our friends from the "Haus der Jugend" (Römerstraße 87, 69115 Heidelberg) will host a tournament wrap party with food and 4 live Bands. All teams are very welcome, if you're staying in Heidelberg for another night. This is not an official WU24 event
